Jeanneau Sun Odyssey 409

The all-new Jeanneau Sun Odyssey 409 was designed by renowned yacht designer Philippe Briand. The result, says Jeanneau, is a modern and elegant yacht with contemporary hull chines, graceful lines and an uncluttered deck.

The innovative deck layout has headsail and mainsail sheets that lead back to primary winches on both sides and are within easy reach of the helmsperson. All lines are led back under the coach roof to make moving about safer.

The Sun Odyssey comes with a self-tacking headsail option, a standard 105 per cent short overlap headsail, or as a performance version with a powerful 140 per cent genoa. There is also the choice of a furling mainsail.

Down below, a contemporary interior design has been achieved using the finest materials available. In addition, more choices

of high-end fabrics and different flooring make the space customisable to each owner's tastes. Several interior layouts are also available, including a two-cabin/single-head option, a three-cabin/single-head version, or a three-cabin/twin-head layout.

Nominated for the prestigious 2010/2011 European Yacht of the Year, the Jeanneau Sun Odyssey 409 arrives in Australia in February.
